This past year demonstrated the powerful impact of philanthropy and how the lives of the children and youth we serve at FACS Niagara can be transformed by the generosity of our community.

One of the most inspiring examples was the success of our fundraising campaign for The Orchard, a group home in Welland. FACS urgently needed a safe, supportive residential program for children aged 8 to 14 whose behavioural and mental health needs require specialized care. While we had a suitable building, it needed major renovations to become a welcoming home for 10 children. Thanks to the overwhelming support of our community, we exceeded our \$450,000 fundraising goal, and the home is set to open in early 2025.

In May 2024, more than 300 community and business leaders came together in Thorold to celebrate our 25th Annual Gala, Springtime in Paris. This unforgettable evening gave guests the chance to meet some of the resilient youth we serve—young people who



are overcoming adversity and thriving, in large part because of donor-supported programs and services.

Last year also marked the 3rd Annual Mountainview LemonAID Day for FACS Niagara—a heartfelt, community-led fundraiser. Over 100 families and local businesses hosted lemonade stands to help give kids in our care the chance to attend summer camp. We’re deeply grateful to Mountainview Homes for championing this “kids helping kids” initiative year after year that helps us send over 380 kids to camp every year.

Looking ahead, we know that the children and youth we serve will continue to rely on the vital support of our donors. We also see the extraordinary outcomes that support makes possible. More and more of our youth are attending postsecondary education—many as the first in their family to do so. In 2024 alone, 89 current and former youth in care received donor-funded bursaries.

Donor generosity also allowed us to deliver life-skills training to youth preparing for independent living, and to host five Home for the Holidays events, where current and former youth in care could celebrate with their FACS Niagara ‘found family.’

At FACS Niagara, we believe that every child can thrive when given the right support at the right time. Every donor-funded camp experience, bursary, cooking class, or holiday gift builds resilience, joy, and self-confidence—laying the foundation for a successful future.

Thank you for sharing in our belief, and in the potential of every child we serve.

Youth Advisory Committee Spotlight: Vladimir

Vlad is like many of the young people FACS is fortunate to work with. He is a survivor. Coming from a world of uncertainty and instability, he's had to be.

At too young an age, Vlad learned how to fend for himself. His parents, dealing with their own challenges around addiction and poverty struggled to provide the basics that people can take for granted.

"We were poor, sometimes homeless, always scrambling just to make it through the day. Life was incredibly hard," he recalled.

Family and Children's Services Niagara was a constant in Vlad's life. The agency did what it could to help the family. Workers brought gifts to help make the holidays feel more normal. They assisted by ensuring the family had food on the table.

"My family and I worked incredibly hard to hide our struggles, so the pieces never quite came together," said Vlad. He kept hoping that the next intervention would be the one that brought lasting change.



At the age of 16, Vlad left the family home and entered into a Voluntary Youth Services Agreement with FACS. “For the first time, I encountered true compassion and patience. I felt seen. I felt like I mattered.”

The agency helped Vlad find a stable living situation – an apartment of his very own! From there, Vlad received help navigating the new world of independence. He got to see a dentist, an optician, and a family doctor who developed a treatment plan to assist with his diagnoses.

“As I got older, FACS continued to offer me experiences I never dreamed of,” said Vlad. He participated in the New Outlooks and Beginnings program where he learned to cook, learned to care for his home, and developed so many of the life skills that would help him become a successful young adult.

“FACS stood by me every step of the way. With practical support and with a warmth and genuine care that I hadn’t known before,” he said.

Today, Vlad is completing a graphic design program in college. He is a valued member of the agency’s Youth Advisory Committee that helps give recommendations and advice to help improve the experience for other youth growing up in care. Vlad has found rewarding employment and volunteers to help animals. He now looks to the future with a great deal of optimism.

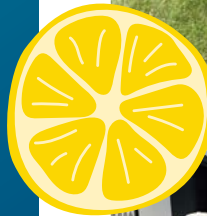

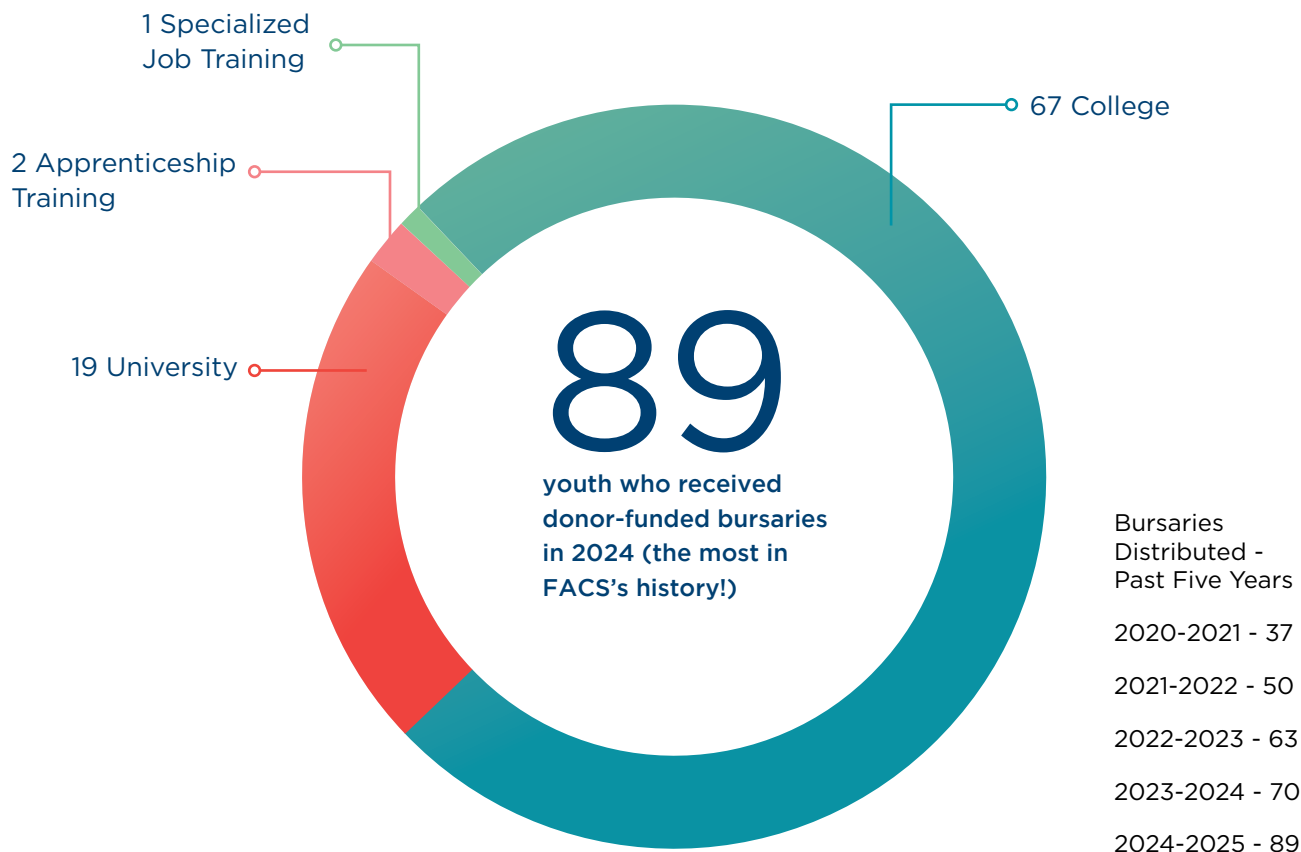

Sam's Journey To Healing And Success

When Sam entered foster care at the age of 14 he struggled heavily with anger and mental health issues which led to him leaving high school soon after. Thanks to his caring foster parents, and his dedicated worker, Barb, Sam slowly began to feel a sense of belonging and stability.

"Ever since I dropped out of high school, Barb always encouraged me to get back into school, keeping my best interest at heart," Sam says. He ended up completing his high school diploma, graduating from

Niagara College in Autism and Behavioural Sciences, and he will be attending Brock University to study psychology in September 2025.

"The FACS team consistently went above and beyond, pushing me to do my best even when self-doubt clouded my mind. Their steadfast belief in me has nurtured seeds of self love and a stable sense of worth within me that has kept me going through it all. Without the support from FACS, I wouldn't be where I am today," he says.

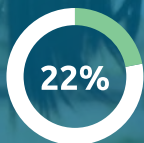
